SUSTAINABILITY

Sustainable development means that: «people living today meet their basic needs without destroying the ability of future generations to meet theirs» (Framework plan, pg 10)

Promoting sustainability in the kindergarten profession is crucial not only for the current generation, but also for the welfare of future generations. This involves creating an awareness of our impact on the environment, promoting a responsibility for nature, and developing sustainable solutions. In practice, this can include activities such as recycling, conservation of resources, learning about ecosystems and participation in projects that emphasize reducing our ecological footprint. By teaching children about sustainability, we empower them to become reflective and responsible global citizens who are able to make informed decisions for a better future.

Our kindergarten must be a place that promotes care for the world we live in, both here and now and in the future. The children must see the value in taking care of themselves, each other, and nature, and we want to teach the children to think critically, act ethically and show solidarity. We use the nursery's immediate area, the forest, as an arena for play and learning where we have free access to good experiences in nature. The children get nature experiences and get to know nature's diversity, and the nursery school wants to contribute to creating a sense of belonging to nature.







Goal: The kindergarten will help the children to understand that today's actions have consequences for the future.

What does that mean to us?:

- The children must learn to take care of themselves, each other, and nature.
- The children will get nature experiences and get to know nature's diversity.
- The children will take part in processes of reuse, selfproduction of food, and reduce of food waste.
- The staff show excitement for being out in nature.
- The staff are curious together with the children.
- The staff are good role models when it comes to reuse, waste, and responsible consumption.

LIFE SKILLS AND HEALTH

«They shall contribute to the children's well-being, happiness, attainment and feeling of self-worth, and they shall combat harassment and bullying. » (Framework plan for kindergarten, pg. 11)

Goal: The kindergarten shall promote the children's physical and mental health.

What does that mean to us?:

- The children should experience coping, physical activity, and possibility for rest.
- The children should experience security, enjoyment of life, and a sense of self-worth.
- The children should experience good relationships and that they are part of the group.
- The staff is close and present throughout the day.
- The staff facilitates both physical activity, and rest.
- The staff are good role models in their relationships with others, both children and staff.







The children's well-being, development and holistic growth are at the center of our educational approach. By promoting physical and mental health, inclusion, diversity, identity, and positive relationships, we give the children a platform for good life skills. In a practical sense, this means creating a caring environment where children feel valued, respected, and able to explore interests and skills. The children must be supported to master adversity, deal with challenges, and get to know their own and other people's feelings.

By working with life skills such as good self-esteem, problem solving and conflict management, children are equipped with the tools they need to handle challenges and thrive in a complex world. Our aim is to foster a positive self-esteem and a strong sense of belonging, thereby helping children to develop into confident and resilient individuals who can embrace life's opportunities and overcome obstacles.

The nursery should be an arena for daily physical activity, promoting enjoyment of movement, and motor development.

The kindergarten must promote friendship and community

«In kindergarten all children shall feel that they are important members of the group and engage in positive interaction with children and adults..»

(Framework plan for kindergarten, pg. 22)

Together with others, the children's self-image and own perception of "who I am" is formed. Safe and caring relationships are important cornerstones in every person's life. It is up to us adults, we must build trust and security in the children. With us, all the children should be able to experience being part of the community, friendship, and good relationships. We are not so concerned with the term "best friend". You can have many good friends, we think, but everyone should be given the opportunity and help to have someone to play with.





Kindergartens shall promote communication and language

«All children shall receive appropriate language stimulation in kindergarten ...» (Framework plan for kindergarten, pg. 23)

Children need a personal language to express how they feel, and we have to facilitate for a good language environment in the kindergarten. We see all situations as good language opportunities, whether it is in bathroom situation, meal, play or reading time. We focus on language development in small groups, both organized as pure language groups, and generally throughout the kindergarten day.

Children who grow up multilingual must encounter the Norwegian language in kindergarten, at the same time as we encourage parents to speak their mother tongue with their children at home. It is important for the children's identity and belonging, as these are languages that are closest to the parents (we call that for the "language of the heart").

The subject areas in the kindergarten:

- Communication, language and text
- Body, movement, food and health
- Art, culture and creativity
- Nature, environment and technology
- Number, space and shape
- · Ethics, religion and philosophy
- Local environment and society

«Kindergartens shall view the learning areas in context, and all learning areas shall be recurring themes in the kindergarten content...

...Kindergartens shall build on the children's enthusiasm and contributions so that the learning areas come to be seen as a meaningful and fun part of kindergarten life...

...The learning areas are substantially the same as the subjects that the children will subsequently encounter at school.» (Framework plan for kindergarten, pg. 47)

THE KINDERGARTEN'S WORKING METHODS:



In practice, this means staff who;

- * shows care and creates security
- * observes and supports children in play
- * participates/are close and is present in play
- * guides the children when needed
- * is an adult the children trust in both good and challenging situations



Working project-based is about tackling a theme, something we/the children are interested in, or a shared experience. How long we work on a theme varies from one day to several weeks. The children's interests and involvement must largely govern what the theme work contains.



We want to give the children the best opportunity to contribute to the everyday life in kindergarten. This is easier in small groups.
